A. Please enclose the following information about the reviewer:

- 1. Reviewer's name
- 2. Reviewer's (highest attained) degree and field of research
- 3. Reviewer's postal address
- 4. Reviewer's e-mail address
- 5. Reviewer's academic position and current research (2-3 lines)

B. Please make certain that the following information about the book is correct:

- 1. Name of author(s) or editor(s)
- 2. Title of book
- 3. Series and number
- 4. Publisher (place, name, year)
- 5. ISBN number
- 6. And please indicate if the book under review contains illustrations, tables, bibliography, index/indices

C. Purpose of the review:

- 1. The review should contribute to the dissemination of new research in the field of the history of rhetoric
- 2. Therefore, the review should be written from the perspective of and with a specific focus on the history of rhetoric

D. The review must contain:

- Information on titles and page numbers of all (main) sections of the book under review
- 2. Faithful summary of
 - a. introduction
 - b. all chapters
 - c. conclusion
 - d. declared purpose and results
 - e. indication of intended readership

3. Evaluation of

- a. relevance to the field of the history of rhetoric
- b. readership suitability
- c. composition/ structure
- d. language/ readability
- e. the results with regard to:
 - 1. novelty (authoritative reinterpretation?)
 - 2. originality
 - 3. character of contribution (dissertation?)
 - 4. position within the research tradition

4. Conclusion

E. Language of review:

English

NB: Reviews written by non-native speakers must be corrected by a native English-speaking colleague or professional copy-editor **before** submission to Rhetorical Review.

F. Style of review:

- 1. Puritas: correct usage, grammar, and syntax
- 2. Claritas: clear argumentation, clear formulations
- 3. Ornatus: genus modicum
- 4. Decorum: sober and readable style; impartial and unbiased attitude

G. Length of review (negotiable):

- 1. Main text: minimum 4.400 characters (including spaces); maximum 17.600 characters (including spaces)
- 2. Notes (optional): maximum 1.100 characters (including spaces)
- 3. Bibliography (optional): maximum 2.200 characters (including spaces)

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Rhetorical Review will only publish reviews of a high professional standard that focus in a sober and impartial manner on the works under review. The editorial board claims the right to edit and correct, and, if necessary, reject reviews that do not meet the above-stated requirements for publication in Rhetorical Review.
